Call for Nominations

Award Description

This award honours an individual, team, network, or organization that has shown outstanding dedication and innovation in advancing Truth and Reconciliation efforts within the healthcare sector for children and youth. Through their initiatives, they have contributed significantly to acknowledging historical injustices, fostering understanding, and promoting reconciliation. Their actions have led to tangible outcomes that contribute to healing and building stronger relationships with Indigenous communities, ultimately making a lasting impact on the journey towards reconciliation in Canadian healthcare.

Nomination Terms

- The nomination must be submitted through the online nomination form no later than June 30, 2024 (at 11:59 PM ET).
- The nominee or representative of the nominated team must consent to the nomination.
- Individuals are invited to self-nominate or they may be nominated by a representative from a Children's Healthcare Canada member organization.
- The Children's Healthcare Canada Awards Selection Committee Directors shall adjudicate the nominations and the awardee will be notified, via email, in early August.
- The recipient of this award will receive one complimentary registration to the 2024 Children's Healthcare Canada's Annual Conference.

- The awardee is expected to attend the Annual Children's Healthcare Canada Awards Ceremony on October 21, 2024 in St. John's, Newfoundland to accept this award.
- The award recipient is expected to record a 2-minute video that will be published to the Children's Healthcare Canada website following the Awards Ceremony on October 21, 2024.
